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# Preface

On behalf of the organizing committee, I am pleased to present the proceedings containing selected, peer-reviewed papers from the 19<sup>th</sup> Professional Culture of the Specialist of the Future (PCSF 2019) which was held on November 28-29, 2019, in St. Petersburg, Russia.

The creation of an interdisciplinary platform for discussing the abilities, skills, knowledge required by future specialists in different fields was the main objective of the conference.

The importance of the conference was that the constantly changing requirements for employees require new approaches to education. It is not enough for a specialist to have professional skills. Soft skills, language knowledge, IT, ethics, health knowledge and many others are needed.

The conference comprised keynote speeches, Keynote speeches “Navigating Multilingual Environments: Philosophy” and “Navigating Multilingual Environments: Linguistics”, plenary sessions: “Educational game design and research” “ «Build to think... build to learn...»” and workshops: “How to Publish Conference Manuscripts in the Web of Science Indexed Journal” “IT skills for all future professionals”. Thematic sections of conference also include:

- Actual problems of higher education
- Actual problems of physical training, sports and health
- New requirements for the professional culture of a specialist in a globalized economy
- Humanistic educational paradigm of the specialist of the future
- Innovative approaches and modern technologies in the theory and practice of teaching foreign languages
- Communication technologies in education. E-learning
- Legal sciences and educational processes development as the basis for the legal and professional culture of a modern specialist
- Philosophical approaches to the professional culture formation of a specialist
- Present-day problems of technoscience. Engineering ethics, ethics of technology
- Actual practices of positive sociocultural development of children

The conference submission management system was [www.easychair.org](http://www.easychair.org). In total 103 papers were accepted while 101 of them were presented at the conference. The presentations were done in the presence 28 and 29 November 2019, from 10 to 19 in parallel sessions. The conference’s international flavour was provided by participants who came from Russia, Belarus, UK, China. The software program used for peer review and plagiarism was [www.easychair.org](http://www.easychair.org) and <https://spbstu.antiplagiat.ru/>. Each submission was subjected to a single-blind review process and average number of reviews per paper 2-3. The number of submissions received and reviewed was 167 and the number of submissions accepted was 103 indicating an acceptance rate of 62%. A total number of reviewers involved 64 were involved in the review process.
