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Preface

On behalf of the organizing committee, I am pleased to present the proceedings containing selected, peer reviewed papers from the IX International Conference “Word, Utterance, Text: Cognitive, Pragmatic and Cultural Aspects” (WUT 2018) which was held in April 18-20, 2018, in Chelyabinsk, Russia. The IX International Conference “Word, Utterance, Text: Cognitive, Pragmatic and Cultural Aspects” (WUT 2018) brings together once in two years scholars and linguists around the world to share research and best practices in their areas of study.

The objective of conference was to provide a forum for the discussion of the latest research connected with the relationships of language, culture and society. The conference facilitates the studied of functional and applied problems of linguistics, translation and methods of foreign language teaching.

The conference comprised keynote speeches, plenary sessions, and workshops which covered thematic sections on Innovative approaches in the linguistics of the XXI century; Discourse as the object of interdisciplinary research; Language picture of the world and interaction of cultures; Topical problems of translation, translation studies and methods of translation teaching; Theory and practice of language teaching.

113 papers were accepted and presented at the conference. Each author was allotted 15 minutes to present their paper. The conference’s international flavour was provided by participants who came from Kazakhstan, the USA, Brazil. The best paper award went to the paper entitled The category of impoliteness in cross-cultural aspect (Tatyana Larina). The review process for the papers was stringent. The software program csu.antiplagiat was used for plagiarism detection. Each submission was subjected to a double-blind review process by two reviewers. The number of submissions received and reviewed was 309 and the number of submissions accepted was 113 indicating an acceptance rate of 36%. A total of 14 reviewers were involved in the review process. The IX International Conference “Word, Utterance, Text: Cognitive, Pragmatic and Cultural Aspects” (WUT 2018) was hosted by Chelyabinsk State University, Chelyabinsk, Russia, and organized by Chelyabinsk State University’s Linguistics and Translation Faculty, in collaboration with L. N. Gumilyov Eurasian National University, Kazakhstan.

The conference chair and organizing committee express their sincere appreciation to all the organizing institutions. Special thanks are due to the two keynote speakers, Professor Sholpan Zharkynbekova (L. N.
