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Preface

On behalf of the organizing committee, I am pleased to present the proceedings containing selected, peer reviewed papers from the III (Post mass media in the modern informational society) "Journalistic text in a new technological environment: achievements and problems" (PMMIS 2019) which was held in 28-29 March 2019, in Chelyabinsk, Russia.

The objective of conference was to identify how to overcome the drawbacks of the accelerated technological development of the communication field and industry; to remove or smoothen out the contradictions that arise in the field of modern training and professionalization of journalists; to clarify problem areas of development and provide guidelines to improve journalism as a social institution and an actor of the modern information society.

The importance of the conference is due to changes in the field of professional journalism in connection with the development of social media, new forms of interpersonal and mass communication.

The conference program included plenary sessions and keynote speeches on the following topics: "General issues of journalism development in a new technological environment", "Social aspects of technological transformation of the industry", "Tools and techniques of online journalism", "Professional culture of a journalist before the challenges of amateurism", "New projects in the field of online journalism and their specificity", "Dissemination of journalistic content in the Internet", "Journalistic text in a new technological environment: linguistic approaches", "Fake news and post-truth effects in the aspect of technological possibilities of modern communication". 107 reports were received, 91 reports were presented at the conference. Each author was allotted 15 minutes to present their paper. In addition to participants from Russia, researchers from Poland, Finland, Algeria, Hungary, the Netherlands, and Belarus took part in the conference. The review process for the papers was strict.

The software program "Antiplagiat" was used for plagiarism detection. Each submission was subjected to a review process by reviewers. The number of submissions received and reviewed was 107 and the number of submissions accepted was 91 indicating an acceptance rate of 85%. In total, 12 reviewers participated in the peer review process, 2 of whom were external to the organization.
